

Steven Cooksey Promoted to President and CEO of Great Southern Bank





CPAs From Across the State Attend MEC Captial Day

Business and community leaders from across the state convened at the Mississippi Trade Mart on January 9 for the annual MEC Capital Day 2025. This event was hosted by the Mississippi Economic Council (MEC) and focused on the organization's priorities during the 2025 legislative session.

Key speakers included Governor Tate Reeves, MEC Chair Pat Thomasson, State Superintendent of Education Dr. Lance Evans, plus others who addressed insights in putting Mississippi in the place of greatest opportunity. Attendees were also bused to the Capital where they heard from Lt. Governor Delbert Hosemann, Speaker of the House Jason White, Senate President Pro Tem Dean Kirby,



and House Speaker Pro Tem Manly Barton who focused on income tax reform, including elimination of the Mississippi income tax and lowering the grocery tax. Medicaid expansion and funding for education, roads, and bridges were also key topics.







Board of Governors Appoints Pipeline Task Force To Consider Alternative Pathway to Licensure

At the December meeting, the Board of Governors approved the formation of a task force to consider an alternative pathway to licensure.

Degree completions in accounting have steadily declined over the past ten years. Studies have shown that the time and cost of the 150-hour requirement for CPA licensure is among the top reasons that students do not select accounting as a major. To combat the decline, states across the country are having conversations on alternative pathways to licensure. In January, Ohio became the first state to pass legislation. While the 150-credit hours rule will remain an option, effective January 1, 2026, two pathways to CPA licensure in Ohio will be available:

- •A bachelor's degree, with an accounting concentration, passing the CPA exam, and two years of experience.
- •A master's degree, with an accounting concentration, passing the CPA exam, and one year of experience.


Several other states also have similar active legislation in process now or plan to have legislation filed in 2025, including the population dense states of California, Florida, and Texas. Others plan to take action in 2026 and 2027.

AICPA and the National Association of State Boards (NASBA) proposed a competency-based pathway option for licensure. As previously reported in the September Newsletter, the comments were received until December 6. Attaining the competencies is expected to take most candidates a year, but there is flexibility in the timing for completion. Candidates would also be required to complete a separate year of general experience and pass the CPA exam. Competencies would be verified in the workplace by licensed CPAs.

Mobility has been front and center in the discussions as states change their pathways to licensure on their own. Ohio and several other states included **automatic mobility** in their legislation but with safeguards, such as requiring a CPA seeking to work in their state to hold a valid CPA license in their home state, obtained a bachelor's or higher degree, completed an education program with an accounting or business concentration, and passed all parts of the CPA exam.

The MSCPA task force is charged with bringing a report to the August 2025 Board meeting. This will allow time to solicit comments, study legislation of other states (especially our border and close states), and to seek advice from the Mississippi State Board of Public Accountancy. If legislation is suggested, a bill can be drafted in the fall for the 2026 Legislative session. Chairman Tom Walker appointed the following members to the task force: Ed Jones, Chairman (MSCPA State Board Liaison), Wil Crawford (Forvis Mazars), Blaise Sonnier (University of Southern Mississippi), Cheryl Sykes (AICPA Council Representative), Anita Goodrum (MSCPA Chair-Elect), and Ex Officio Karen Moody (President/CEO).

Advising Clients in a Divorce: 10 Tips to Remember By Jim Angle, CPA/ABV, CVA

From time to time, you will have clients going through divorces. If this is not an area where you or others in your firm have experience, consider the following tips when advising clients in a divorce:

- 1. **Valuing the Business** If a business is part of the marital estate, it is important to remember that for Mississippi divorce purposes goodwill is excluded. As a result of Singley v Singley, Watson v Watson, and Yelverton v Yelverton, Mississippi is the only state where personal goodwill and entity goodwill are not considered. As a result, the net asset value method with applicable discounts for lack of control and marketability is the only valuation methodology allowed. The income and market methodologies are not allowed because they contain elements of goodwill.
- 2. **Valuation Date** When valuing a business, the courts set the date of demarcation for the marital estate. In Collins v Collins, the Mississippi Supreme Court determined that the chancery court may use any date when determining the line of demarcation between marital and separate property. Before a business is valued, request that your client's attorney receives guidance from the court on what date to use for valuing the business.
- 3. **Negative Business Value** In Gutierrez v Gutierez, the liabilities of the business exceeded the assets; therefore, the value was none. On appeal, the husband argued that the value should be negative, which is not considered for fair market value purposes. For various reasons, this argument was not accepted by the Mississippi Court of Appeals. Therefore, when the financial disclosure form is prepared, it is important to include any excess liabilities where one or both of parties are personally liable for the excess debt and provide documentation to the court for possible consideration of this liability.
- 4. **Valuation Report** Sometimes the attorney and client may deem a business valuation report not to be necessary for various reasons. However, as shown in Lacoste v Lacoste, that decision could prove costly. In the Lacoste case, no valuation report was presented during the trial, which lead to the chancery court valuing the business. The result was the Mississippi Court of Appeals reversed the chancery court and ordered a business valuation to be prepared.
- 5. **Personal Expenses Paid By The Business** In certain situations, it is necessary to quantify personal expenses paid by the business to determine the availability of funds for child support and alimony. Examples of this might include a company car and related vehicle expenses, meals, entertainment, tickets to sporting events, dues to country and hunting clubs, and other discretionary expenses not needed to operate the business.
- 6. Form 8.05 The chancery courts require the parties to submit a financial disclosure form, which is called Form 8.05. This form is extremely important because it assists the court in determining financial support and a property settlement. A CPA can provide a valuable service by preparing a credible Form 8.05 for a client. Our office provides these forms in Excel to CPAs who request them for their clients.
- 7. **Tax Basis** While the values of assets in the martial estate are important, the tax basis of those assets can be just as important and often overlooked. The CPA can provide valuable information in determining of unrealized gains or losses on those assets, which can be addressed on the Form 8.05 for consideration by the court. If one party receives \$500,000 of stock in NVIDIA Corporation which has tremendously grown in value and the other party receives \$500,000 in bonds with little gain, the party receiving the NVIDIA stock is also taking on the unrealized taxable gain.
- 8. **Tax Liability** With emotions running high in divorces, one of the parties may not want to sign the individual income tax return with the other party. If married filing separately causes one party to pay additional income taxes, the court, as determined in Fitzgerald v Fitzgerald, can require the parties to file as married filing jointly or assess the additional income taxes to the party, who is not willing to sign the tax return.
- 9. **PERS of Mississippi** While defined benefit and defined contribution plans can be divided with a Qualified Domestic Relations Order [QDRO], the Public Employees Retirement System of Mississippi does not allow for a division of a person's benefits to be divided. While some states, such as Louisiana, have enacted legislation that allows for state funded retirement plans to be divided, Mississippi has not.
- 10. **Conflicts of Interest** With the issuance of the American Institute of CPAs' Revised Interpretation 102-2, CPAs are prohibited from representing two clients at the same time in a legal dispute. This would include providing valuation and forensic services as an expert witness to one party when both parties have been clients. Therefore, if a CPA has provided tax and accounting services to the husband and wife in the past, that CPA is deemed to have a conflict when providing expert witness services, unless a consent can be obtained. Terminating one of the parties as a client to provide services in the divorce to other party does not resolve the conflict of interest.

Considering these tips will provide valuable services to your clients facing divorces, and they will appreciate it.




